New England Ocean Survey
Results by State and Political Affiliation
Adult Population 18+
July 11, 2016

This document reports the findings from a survey of 400 citizens in the state of Massachusetts and 403 citizens of Rhode Island. The survey was conducted between June 21 and July 1, 2016 using random digit-dial landline and cell phone samples. Sampling employed all best practices for reaching cell-only households. Interviewing was controlled to be representative for gender, age, ethnicity and county residency. The margin of error for each state sample is +/-5.0 percentage points at the 95% confidence level. The document shows the survey questions in the order and exact wording in which they were asked.
